Match Summary

The Bay Malton Border team had a thoroughly deserved victory on a desperately poor Macclesfield Canal.

An initial practice session for six of the team didn't produce a single bite and when Cinderland Black practiced the following day they had the misfortune of seeing 17 blanks!

With enthusiasm dampened, plans for a second practice session were abandoned but the team felt confident that if the venue was to fish as poorly on the day then no team would have an advantage and that could make for a really close contest.

The team plan was to fish bread punch for the small roach but to start the match fishing a larger piece of punch in the hope of catching an early unwary larger fish. The only angler for whom this worked was Greg Hulme and his single roach was enough to win the match.

For the rest of the team it was a case of concentrating hard to get just a single fish. At the end of the match there was just a single section where one of the two opposing teams had caught and Bay Malton Border hadn't and we had the worst of the three pegs in that section. More importantly, Scott Rutter and Les Hobson had both managed to catch a single fish each with both of the opponents in their respective sections blanking. With solid second places in section from Dave Hope (5 fish) and Neil Jellis (4 fish) the team overcame a difficult tie which the home team hadn't expected to lose.

The second round will take place on Sunday 8th May but at the time of writing the draw has yet to be made.
